

respond to road conditions changing faster than Lance Briggs' alibi. The result is a car that can be comfortably sped to Sbarro on Saturday night and tossed around at the track on Sunday morning. The six-speed manual tranny offers a ballsy open gate with a small learning curve, while Audi's R tronic automatic eliminates the clutch pedal and gives drivers the option of an

aluminum shifter, wheel-mounted paddles, or an automatic shift-by-wire. Gauges are where they should be, and the interior's mix of brushed aluminum, leather, and carbon fiber make it feel like a spaceship on wheels. The defining design details, however, are the aesthetic sideblades behind the doors. Six figures to be able to say "sideblades' all the time? What a bargain.
